South Africa, Dear Sir

I am pleased to forward to you the information about the lonely island of Tristan Da Cunha on the 2nd Oct. 1924 We had a heavy gale of wind from the South East which damage all our first potato crops which we planted in June and July months and our second crops of potatoes we plant in August and our main crops of potatoes we plant in September and during the first week in October for our main crops of potatoes are coming on well at the present time but the islanders will be very short of potatoes up till about the New year but I will let you know more about our crops later for at the present time several of families are living on the sea birds and their eggs for we had to go across to Nightingale island for fresh eggs for to eat and we brought across two coats coats and we also brought several coats of eggs from the South part of the island of Tristan for the islanders have used up over forty thousand sea birds eggs in September & October and over two thousand sea birds and are very glad to get them

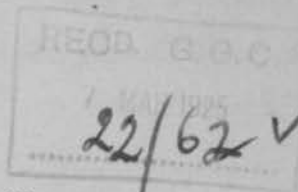
