VOYAGE 147: 03 SEPTEMBER -13 OCTOBER 2009

1. The mv S.A. Agulhas will depart from Cape Town on 03 September 2009 at **14:00**, on her annual relief voyage to Gough Island and Tristan da Cunha.

2. The voyage schedule (**Annexure A**), passenger list (**Annexure B**), cabin allocations (**Annexure C**), base room allocations (**Annexure D**) and SANAP base rules (**Annexure E**) are attached for your information and further attention.

3. TRAVEL DOCUMENTS

All persons accompanying the voyage must be in possession of valid passports and residence or visitor's permits where applicable. The afore-mentioned documents must be handed to the ship's Catering Officer (Purser) **at least 24 hours before** departure. Persons not complying with this request will be responsible for arranging their own customs and immigration clearance. All passport details are to be forwarded to Mr. Sam Oosthuizen or Noma Ntantiso on or before 2 September 2009 to arrange for immigration clearance. Those participants, whose details have not been received, will be responsible for their own immigration/customs clearance. The ship will not be delayed for these purposes.

4. AIR, DINGHY AND BOAT SUPPORT

An inflatable dinghy will be available for scientific/conservation purposes. It may be used in support of *bona fide* scientific/conservation activities only and may be based ashore if necessary. All persons using the dinghy do so at their own risk and under the conditions given in the attached document (**Annexure G**).

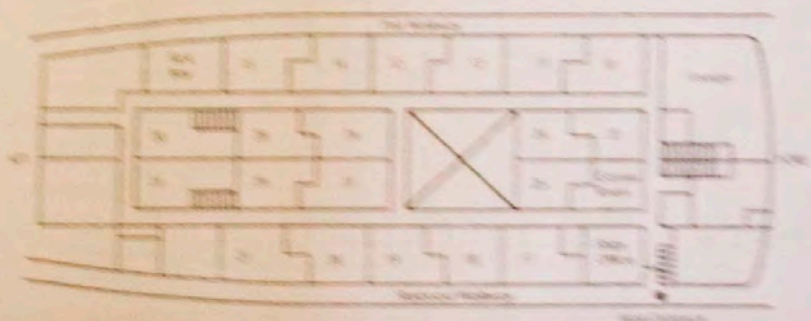

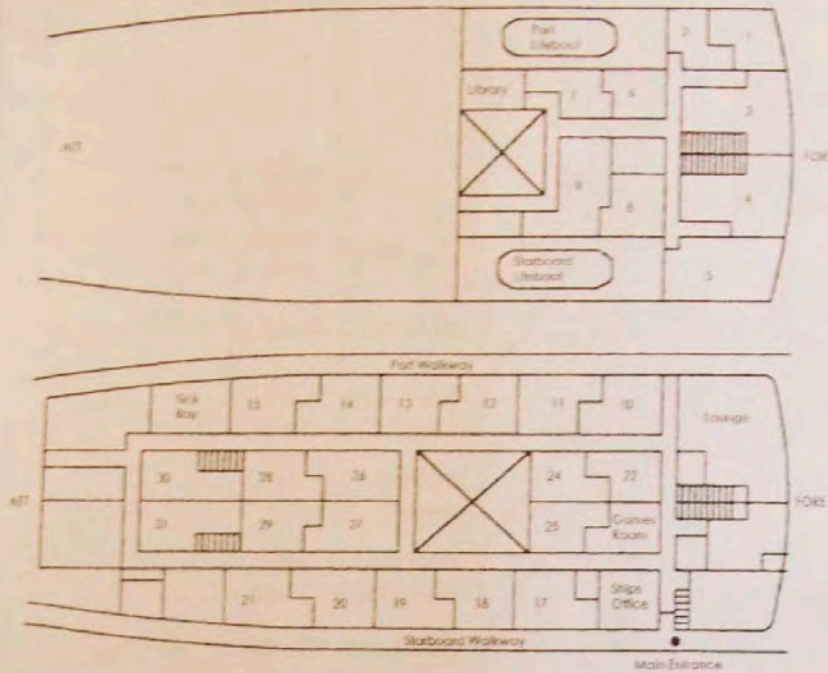
